## CONDITIONS OF SALE

### Bidding

1. The placing of a bid will constitute acceptance of the conditions of sale.
2. All bids are per lot as numbered in the catalog. The right is reserved to withdraw any lot or lots and to group two or more lots.
3. Lots are sold to the highest bidder at one advance over the second highest bid. The auctioneer shall regulate the bidding and in the event of any dispute the auctioneer's decision shall be final.
4. The auctioneer shall not be liable for errors and omissions in executing instructions to bid.
5. Unlimited bids and bids believed not to be made in good faith will be respectfully declined.
6. Minimum bid on any lot is \$50.00.
7. All lots will be sold at the price for which they are knocked down by the auctioneer, plus a commission of 15%.

### Payment of Purchases

8. Successful bidders will be notified of lots purchased and must remit before lots are delivered. Persons who are known to us may, at our option, have purchases forwarded for immediate payment.
9. Terms are immediate payment in U.S. funds on receipt of the invoice. Payment by credit card will be subject to a 2% service charge.
10. The mode of shipment shall be at our option unless we are given specific instructions. A minimum charge of \$1.50 will be made in addition to postage, insurance, and handling.
11. Successful bidders agree to pay for lots as specified above and no credit is extended. For overdue accounts a late charge of 5% per month (minimum \$30.00) will be charged. Accounts are considered overdue after (30) days.

### Quality

12. Any lot, the description of which is incorrect, is returnable within ten (10) days of receipt and must be received within four weeks from the date of the auction. All disputed lots must be returned intact in the condition received. The following lots may not be returned without prior approval: lots from buyers who have had the opportunity to examine them before the sale; lots described as having defects or faults may not be returned because of faults; and, lots in which the buyer has bid more than double our estimate. No illustrated lot may be returned because of centering, margins, or other factors shown in the illustrations.

### Authenticity

13. All lots are sold as genuine, but should any lot be proved otherwise by written opinion of any responsible authority acceptable to us, immediate refund of the full purchase price will be made, provided we are notified in writing within 14 days from date of sale that an opinion is being sought. If claim is not made within this period, no lots are returnable for any reason at any time. We will not be responsible for any charges incurred by the buyer for expertization fees and costs unless the opinion states the item is not genuine, in which case we will pay actual costs up to a maximum of \$100.00. In the event an item is proved "not as described" it is returnable for a full refund. Any lot which has a certificate dated within the last five years is sold in accordance with the certificate and is not returnable for any reason including an opinion obtained in a new certificate after the sale. While we occasionally suggest what grade a coin may receive if certified, we do guarantee that grade (or any other grade) if a coin is submitted for certification.

2	1795 Punctuated Date; Lettered Edge F detail but excavated w/ heavily corroded surfaces. Despite the damage, the details of the coin are easily discernable. On the Punctuated Date variety, the date shows as 1,795. Punctuated dates come with both Plain and Lettered edges, w/ the Lettered being the scarcer of the two.	EST	330-450	SE
3	1804 Plain 4; Stemless perhaps F by wear but w/ some corrosion.	EST	70-90	SE

Of the official mintage of 333,456 large cents dated 1857, experts estimate that approximately 140,000 were actually released to circulation. Of that quantity, the small date coins are clearly scarcer than those with large dates, and of the two varieties of small dates (N2 and N4), N2 is the scarcer of the two. Though not considered a "rare" coin, we seldom offer this issue, so the opportunity may be worth seizing.	EST P	220-280	SE
11	1857 Small Date N-2. Another of this issue, but this one, while perhaps VF by wear and original, has rather severe damage in the form of rim bumps and gashes around virtually the entire coin. Not what you would want in your best set of large cents, but acceptable as a filler.	EST P	45-60	SE

12	1858 over 1858 Fine. Though likely strike doubling, it is still prominent and easily visible.	EST	40-60	SE

13	1864-L VF even medium-brown. A beautiful coin for the issue. In 1864, cost pressure combined w/ striking issues resulted in a decision to change the composition of the one-cent piece from the 88% copper - 12% nickel blend then in use, to one of softer bronze (95% copper and 5% tin.) New dies would be used for the bronze cents that would have minor differences from the ones used for the copper-nickel cents, the most significant one being the addition of the designer's initial "L" (for James B. Longacre) placed on the ribbon extending down from the Indian's feather bonnet. Due to the great demand for small change in 1864, the mint initially used the existing dies (without the "L") for the bronze cents for several months before the new dies were ready. This circumstance created (3) distinct issues for 1864 cents - copper/nickel AND bronze cents without the "L", and then the scarcest of the three, produced in late 1864 and thereafter, the bronze issue WITH the "L". (This mostly was the result of the Mint's redemption and re-issue policy of the day, along with a general slowdown in economic activity around 1877.)
