## CONDITIONS OF SALE

## Bidding

1. The placing of a bid will constitute acceptance of the conditions of sale.
2. All bids are per lot as numbered in the catalog. The right is reserved to withdraw any lot or lots and to group two or more lots.
3. Lots are sold to the highest bidder at one advance over the second highest bid. The auctioneer shall regulate the bidding and in the event of any dispute the auctioneer's decision shall be final.
4. The auctioneer shall not be liable for errors and omissions in executing instructions to bid.
5. Unlimited bids and bids believed not to be made in good faith will be respectfully declined.
6. Minimum bid on any lot is $\$ 50.00$.
7. All lots will be sold at the price for which they are knocked down by the auctioneer, plus a commission of $15 \%$.

## Payment of Purchases

8. Successful bidders will be notified of lots purchased and must remit before lots are delivered. Persons who are known to us may, at our option, have purchases forwarded for immediate payment.
9. Terms are immediate payment in U.S. funds on receipt of the invoice. Payment by credit card will be subject to a $2 \%$ service charge.
10. The mode of shipment shall be at our option unless we are given specific instructions. A minimum charge of $\$ 1.50$ will be made in addition to postage, insurance, and handling.
11. Successful bidders agree to pay for lots as specified above and no credit is extended. For overdue accounts a late charge of $5 \%$ per month (minimum $\$ 30.00$ ) will be charged. Accounts are considered overdue after (30) days.

## Quality

To help fund the monument, Congress authorized the minting and sale of a commemorative dollar coin in the same spirit that it authorized the issue of the Columbian half dollars to help defray the costs of the Columbian Exhibition in 1892-93. A separate program encouraged schoolchildren to donate their small change to help erect the statue - a fact noted on the coin's reverse inscription. Although Lafayette Dollars are dated 1900, all were struck in a single day on Dec 14th 1899, the 100th anniversary of George Washington's death. Ultimately, 36,026 were sold by the Lafayette Memorial Commission (for $\$ 2$ each.) The Lafayette Dollar holds a unique place among US coins in that it is the first commemorative DOLLAR struck by the US, and further, it is the first American coin to depict a President, a practice that arguably would be employed to a fault later in the 20th Century.
