## CONDITIONS OF SALE

## Bidding

1. The placing of a bid will constitute acceptance of the conditions of sale.
2. All bids are per lot as numbered in the catalog. The right is reserved to withdraw any lot or lots and to group two or more lots.
3. Lots are sold to the highest bidder at one advance over the second highest bid. The auctioneer shall regulate the bidding and in the event of any dispute the auctioneer's decision shall be final.
4. The auctioneer shall not be liable for errors and omissions in executing instructions to bid.
5. Unlimited bids and bids believed not to be made in good faith will be respectfully declined.
6. Minimum bid on any lot is $\$ 50.00$.
7. All lots will be sold at the price for which they are knocked down by the auctioneer, plus a commission of $15 \%$.

## Payment of Purchases

8. Successful bidders will be notified of lots purchased and must remit before lots are delivered. Persons who are known to us may, at our option, have purchases forwarded for immediate payment.
9. Terms are immediate payment in U.S. funds on receipt of the invoice. Payment by credit card will be subject to a $2 \%$ service charge.

8 (3) Diff Classic Heads incl 1826 near XF w/ scratches upon magnification, 182813 Stars near VF, and 1834 F.

## Large Cents

91814 Classic Head Plain 4 S-295 "Bearded Variety" VF+ by wear w/ attractive even color. There is a 5 mm diagonal scratch starting at the $B$ of the headband and extending more lightly to the chin of Liberty. A bit of planchet pitting is near star 8 , and a rev rim imperfection is at K5. This is the "bearded" variety so called due to die crumbling under Liberty's chin making it look as though she has a short beard. Data shows that the Mint exhausted its supply of cent planchets in Oct of 1814 right after the crosslet 4 variety (S-294) was issued. A fire at the Mint in 1815 destroyed the rolling machines before any cents could be issued that year (the only year the Mint did not issue a one-cent coin.) Numismatic researcher R.W. Julian, among others, has indicated that the new Matron Head design was not employed for striking cents until midway through 1816. Since records show that the Mint received a shipment of cent planchets in early 1816, and made a delivery of cents shortly thereafter, a strong case can be made for this delivery being made up of the 1814 Plain 4 issue. In any event, this lot is worth serious consideration despite the flaws as Classic Head large cents are very scarce with this much detail.
101847 XF or very nearly so. Even brown color and very eye-appealing.
11 (21) 1794 // 1837 all low grade w/ some corrosion. A few dates are questionable. Expect the typical problems found w/ excavated copper.
12 (37) 1795 // $1856 \mathrm{w} /$ dup (there is an 1809 Half Cent in the group.) Incl (8) Capped/Draped, (5) Classic Heads, (8) Middle Dates, and the rest late dates. Most dates and legends are readable, but low-grade coins throughout.
13 (38) 1795 // 1856 w/ dup incl (9) Capped/Draped, (4) Classic Heads, (9) Middle Dates, and the rest Braided Hair late dates. Low grades (some very low) but most dates and legends are readable. Good lot for the variety hunter.
14 (80) Culls incl mostly Middle \& Late dates plus a few Draped, and a few British Ha’pennies and Hard Times tokens. Expect typical damage and corrosion. Not all dates legends are readable.
Flying Eagle Cents
151857 XF light rev scratches \& 1858 Large Letters XF+ (2 coins total)
1858 Small Letters MS60. There is a light 5 mm obv scratch under RICA traversing the eagle's tail feathers to the rim at K4. However, the distinguishing feature of this coin is the dramatic doubling of the date and the eagle's right wing. While doubling is not rare among the Flying Eagle Cents, the anomaly makes for an interesting coin.

## Indian Cents

171859 Uncirculated. The coin has been lightly cleaned but has a full strike and ample eye-appeal. A nice example of the one-year type!

Earlies gen Poor/AG to F, laters better w/ sev nice VF+ or better. Bonus: a second partial set (12) 1862 // 1906 most G to F in a Capitol 63-Coin frame. Inspect!
41 (48) Diff 1859 // 1909 in a partial set (Dansco 7101 album) missing only 1864 Bronze (there is a $64-\mathrm{L}$ ), $1871,1872,1875,1877,1878$, 1897 \& 1909-S. Many earlies are VF to AU w/ a few cleaned or brightened. Most laters VF to low Mint State. The lot needs inspection as many of these coins are far better than that typically seen.
42 (3) Diff incl 1900, 1904, \& 1907 all MS63 Brown. Well-struck coins w/ some red showing in the recessed areas.

43 (85) 1857 // 1864 CN all copper-nickel cents culls to avg circ.

## Twenty Cent Pieces

72 1875-S G+ original. The distinguishing feature is that the coin is a broadstrike. This is an error that occurs when the collar that holds the planchet during striking fails to engage. The result is that coin has an indistinct periphery and, given that there is no collar during striking, a slightly wider diameter than that of a normal coin. Error twenty-cent pieces are seldom encountered.
73 1875-S F beautiful originality and no problems.
74 1875-S VF lovely darker grey original.

## Bust Quarters

751824 over 2 PCGS VG Detail Tooled. Obviously cleaned but maintains some of its original color and is still attractive overall. PCGS is noting it as "tooled" because a previous attempt to remove dirt left light scratches by the date. Magnification is required to see the marks clearly. Fifty years ago the 1824 was no more expensive than other dates of the Bust series. But its value has increased dramatically as its true scarcity became more well known.

971876 Proof PR60+. Dark obv toning a bit uneven, the coin shows evidence of early mishandling which is the norm for proofs of this era. From a mintage of 1,150 PCGS shows 246 submitted for grading and undoubtedly many of these were re-submissions.

## COMMERMORATIVE ARTS GOLD MEDALS

This program was the precursor to the American Eagle program which yielded the Gold and Silver American Eagles starting in 1986.

181 Grant Wood (1980) One-Ounce Gold Medal issued as part of the American Arts Commemorative Series. (1 ozt AGW) (See the previous lot description for more information.) The Grant Wood and Marion Anderson medals were the initial issues of this series. Later issues featured Louis Armstrong, Mark Twain, and Frank Lloyd Wright, just to name a few. Initial interest in the program was high as American citizens were eager to own US Mint-issued gold. But interest waned as the program continued resulting in much smaller mintages as the years progressed. This cataloger believes that a primary reason for this is that, unlike Gold Eagles, the American Arts Commemoratives were minted as bullion coins only, and fail to have any legal tender status. That notwithstanding, they have an interesting history, are attractive in design, and worth their full weight in precious metal, but are generally overlooked by present collectors.
