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## CONDITIONS OF SALE

### Bidding

1. The placing of a bid will constitute acceptance of the conditions of sale.
2. All bids are per lot as numbered in the catalog. The right is reserved to withdraw any lot or lots and to group two or more lots.
3. Lots are sold to the highest bidder at one advance over the second highest bid. The auctioneer shall regulate the bidding and in the event of any dispute the auctioneer's decision shall be final.
4. The auctioneer shall not be liable for errors and omissions in executing instructions to bid.
5. Unlimited bids and bids believed not to be made in good faith will be respectfully declined.
6. Minimum bid on any lot is \$50.00.
7. All lots will be sold at the price for which they are knocked down by the auctioneer, plus a commission of 15%.

### Payment of Purchases

8. Successful bidders will be notified of lots purchased and must remit before lots are delivered. Persons who are known to us may, at our option, have purchases forwarded for immediate payment.
9. Terms are immediate payment in U.S. funds on receipt of the invoice. Payment by credit card will be subject to a 2% service charge.
10. The mode of shipment shall be at our option unless we are given specific instructions. A minimum charge of \$1.50 will be made in addition to postage, insurance, and handling.
11. Successful bidders agree to pay for lots as specified above and no credit is extended. For overdue accounts a late charge of 5% per month (minimum \$30.00) will be charged. Accounts are considered overdue after (30) days.

### Quality

12. Any lot, the description of which is incorrect, is returnable within ten (10) days of receipt and must be received within four weeks from the date of the auction. All disputed lots must be returned intact in the condition received. The following lots may not be returned without prior approval: lots from buyers who have had the opportunity to examine them before the sale; lots described as having defects or faults may not be returned because of faults; and, lots in which the buyer has bid more than double our estimate. No illustrated lot may be returned because of centering, margins, or other factors shown in the illustrations.

### Authenticity

13. All lots are sold as genuine, but should any lot be proved otherwise by written opinion of any responsible authority acceptable to us, immediate refund of the full purchase price will be made, provided we are notified in writing within 14 days from date of sale that an opinion is being sought. If claim is not made within this period, no lots are returnable for any reason at any time. We will not be responsible for any charges incurred by the buyer for expertization fees and costs unless the opinion states the item is not genuine, in which case we will pay actual costs up to a maximum of \$100.00. In the event an item is proved "not as described" it is returnable for a full refund. There is a 5mm diagonal scratch starting at the B of the headband and extending more lightly to the chin of Liberty. A bit of planchet pitting is near star 8, and a rev rim imperfection is at K5. This is the "bearded" variety so called due to die crumbling under Liberty's chin making it look as though she has a short beard. Data shows that the Mint exhausted its supply of cent planchets in Oct of 1814 right after the crosslet 4 variety (S-294) was issued. A fire at the Mint in 1815 destroyed the rolling machines before any cents could be issued that year (the only year the Mint did not issue a one-cent coin.) Numismatic researcher R.W. Julian, among others, has indicated that the new Matron Head design was not employed for striking cents until midway through 1816. Since records show that the Mint received a shipment of cent planchets in early 1816, and made a delivery of cents shortly thereafter, a strong case can be made for this delivery being made up of the 1814 Plain 4 issue. In any event, this lot is worth serious consideration despite the flaws as Classic Head large cents are very scarce with this much detail.	EST P	400-600	SE
