## Bidding

1. The placing of a bid will constitute acceptance of the conditions of sale.

3. Lots are sold to the highest bidder at one advance over the second highest bid. The auctioneer shall regulate the bidding and in the event of any dispute the auctioneer's decision shall be final.
4. The auctioneer shall not be liable for errors and omissions in executing instructions to bid.
5. Unlimited bids and bids believed not to be made in good faith will be respectfully declined.
6. Minimum bid on any lot is $\$ 50.00$.
7. All lots will be sold at the price for which they are knocked down by the auctioneer, plus a commission of $15 \%$.

## Payment of Purchases

8. Successful bidders will be notified of lots purchased and must remit before lots are delivered. Persons who are known to us may, at our option, have purchases forwarded for immediate payment.
9. Terms are immediate payment in U.S. funds on receipt of the invoice. Payment by credit card will be subject to a $2 \%$ service charge.

## Colonial Coins

11783 Nova Constellatio Small US Blunt Rays NGC Fine Details Damaged. Nice coin closer to VF than F, and this cataloger cannot find evidence of the "damage" that the coin is supposed to have. Though struck in England by a private mint and modeled after the Nova Constellatio pattern coinage of 1783, these coins entered circulation in NY most likely a few years after the actual dates they possess. The present coin, despite the NGC labeling, is a very nice representation of the coinage of Colonial America.

## Half Cents

2182813 Stars full AU+ detail but there is a faint obv scratch and the letters "RL" lightly etched into the left obv field.
31829 Classic Head PCGS AU58
41835 MS60++ (perhaps better) brown. Evidence of clashed dies but this coin is devoid of the die crack that traverses the rev on later die states. Inspect!
51851 Braided Hair PCGS AU55. A mysterious grade by PCGS in that the coin has beautiful light brown color and no discernable wear.
6 (5) Diff incl a Draped Bust 1805 and the rest Classic Heads 1825 // 1835. Coins are in the F/VF grade range by wear but have nicks and minor corrosion typical of the copper coins of the period. Bonus: (2) additional but lower grade coins.
7 (3) Diff incl 1809 G, 1828 13-Stars VG, \& 1835 F. Expect typical copper coin imperfections.

## Large Cents

81801 S-214 (R3) Fine. Typical "look" of early copper w/ surfaces likely re-colored but even in appearance.
91805 S-269 VF even brown. A desirable Draped Bust Large Cent excellent for type.
101809 Classic Head S-280 VG+ detail w/ even color and uniform light corrosion. Still an appealing coin for a better date in the large cent series.
111812 Classic Head Large Date (S-288) PCGS XF40. A beautiful coin given the scarcity of Classic Head large cents in higher grade. Though not rare by any means, this variety is the scarcest of the (4) for 1812.
12 (10) Diff Middle Dates 1816 // 1829 incl 1816 N2 w/ rotated die, 1817 N9, 1817 " 15 Stars" N16, 1818 N7, 1819 N8, 1820 N10, 1822 N13 (scarce - R5), 1825 N6, 1826 N5, \& 1829 N5. AG to F most abt VG.
13 (14) Diff 1816 // 1855 nice mix of Matron and Braided Hair. Earlies generally G/VG, laters somewhat better.

15 (10) Diff Late Date die varieties incl 1840 N5, 1840 N8, 1841 N6, 1842 N6, 1842 N7, 1843 N4 (Petite Head; Large Letters which is a Red Book variety), 1847 N8, 1848 N6, 1852 N3, \& 1855 N12 (Upright 5's). Coins are G to $\mathrm{F}+$ originals most at the high end.

## Indian Cents

16 1864-L XF+ detail. Full LIBERTY and clear L on the ribbon but the coin is a dark color, and has a few very light corroded areas. Worth inspection despite the flaws, it's still appealing.
171875 MS63+ Red Brown (nearly full red). A beautiful coin. There are curious vertical die file lines above and below the Indian's ear as well as in front of the forehead. Bowers makes no mention of this in his book on Indian cents but surely they can be researched in a more authoritative reference such as Snow. They do not at all detract from the excellent eye appeal of this coin.
1899 MS60+ "red" from an earlier dipping. Still attractive.
1908-S VF beautiful even brown color but there is a light 5 mm rev scratch going thru O of "ONE". Inspect.
20 1908-S F+ lovely even medium brown.
21 1909-S G+ perhaps better. Wood-grained effect but confined to the obv. There is also a 2 mm obv mark on the headdress above the ear. Still an ok coin for this scarce issue.
