## CONDITIONS OF SALE

### Bidding

1. The placing of a bid will constitute acceptance of the conditions of sale.
2. All bids are per lot as numbered in the catalog. The right is reserved to withdraw any lot or lots and to group two or more lots.
3. Lots are sold to the highest bidder at one advance over the second highest bid. The auctioneer shall regulate the bidding and in the event of any dispute the auctioneer's decision shall be final.
4. The auctioneer shall not be liable for errors and omissions in executing instructions to bid.
5. Unlimited bids and bids believed not to be made in good faith will be respectfully declined.
6. Minimum bid on any lot is \$50.00.
7. All lots will be sold at the price for which they are knocked down by the auctioneer, plus a commission of 15%.

### Payment of Purchases

8. Successful bidders will be notified of lots purchased and must remit before lots are delivered. Persons who are known to us may, at our option, have purchases forwarded for immediate payment.
9. Terms are immediate payment in U.S. funds on receipt of the invoice. Payment by credit card will be subject to a 2% service charge.
10. The mode of shipment shall be at our option unless we are given specific instructions. A minimum charge of \$1.50 will be made in addition to postage, insurance, and handling.
11. Successful bidders agree to pay for lots as specified above and no credit is extended. For overdue accounts a late charge of 5% per month (minimum \$30.00) will be charged. Accounts are considered overdue after (30) days.

### Quality

12. Any lot, the description of which is incorrect, is returnable within ten (10) days of receipt and must be received within four weeks from the date of the auction. All disputed lots must be returned intact in the condition received. The following lots may not be returned without prior approval: lots from buyers who have had the opportunity to examine them before the sale; lots described as having defects or faults may not be returned because of faults; and, lots in which the buyer has bid more than double our estimate. No illustrated lot may be returned because of centering, margins, or other factors shown in the illustrations.

### Authenticity

13. All lots are sold as genuine, but should any lot be proved otherwise by written opinion of any responsible authority acceptable to us, immediate refund of the full purchase price will be made, provided we are notified in writing within 14 days from date of sale that an opinion is being sought. If claim is not made within this period, no lots are returnable for any reason at any time. We will not be responsible for any charges incurred by the buyer for expertization fees and costs unless the opinion states the item is not genuine, in which case we will pay actual costs up to a maximum of \$100.00. In the event an item is proved "not as described" it is returnable for a full refund. Any lot which has a certificate dated within the last five years is sold in accordance with the certificate and is not returnable for any reason including an opinion obtained in a new certificate after the sale. While we occasionally suggest what grade a coin may receive if certified, we do guarantee that grade (or any other grade) if a coin is submitted for certification.

<b>Half Cents</b>		
1	1793 Liberty Cap Facing Left Fair-2. The coin is easily identified though the date is very weak. The Cohen Number is likely C2. Despite the extensive wear, it is amazing that there is no corrosion or any other problem worth mentioning. This is the first 1793 Half Cent we have offered in quite some time. Worth a look!	EST P 1,000-1,500 SE
2	1794 Liberty Cap Facing Right perhaps VG detail but the coin has endured some damage and has a 3mm corrosion spot just off Liberty's forehead. Inspection recommended.	EST P 160-200 SE
<b>Large Cents</b>		
3	1793 Flowing Hair Chain Cent Fr-2. Extensive wear prevents determining the Sheldon variety (Chain Cents can be S1, S2, S3 or S4), but the chain is clearly visible and the coin has virtually no corrosion. Perhaps an affordable example of our nation's first coins, struck during a 2-week period in March of 1793. Some felt that the chain signified bondage of some kind, and after striking 36,103 chain cents, the mint replaced the design with the wreath reverse later in the year. The higher mintage and survival rates of the wreath cents of 1793 makes them a bit more available than those with the chain reverse, though both are cherished by collectors of early copper.	EST P 2,000-2,800 SE
4	1793 Flowing Hair Wreath Cent S-11c VG details but w/ a 3mm hole below LIBERTY. Though the date does not show, the wreath is clear, and the S-11 attribution is an easy one due to all three leaves on the sprig below Liberty pointing to the right. Further, the lettered edge has only one leaf after the words "One Hundred for a Dollar" making it sub-variety "C". (Variety A has a Vine and Bars edge, and Variety B has TWO leaves after the inscription.) Most collectors would shun a coin that is holed, but early copper cents usually have some significant problems. Because the Flowing Hair Cents have such an interesting history, they remain collectible even w/ major defects.	EST P 550-800 SE
5	1802 S-241 & 1807 over 6 S-273 both AG/G but solid w/ no corrosion. Both interesting varieties. S-241 has an S punched below the second S in STATES faintly visible on the present coin, and the S-273 overdate is boldly displayed even on worn coins.	EST 100-125 SE
6	1818 Matron Head N6 VF+ perhaps a bit better. Nice even medium brown. There is a 3mm planchet flaw by stars 1 & 2. The N6 variety is identified by the strong inner circle near the dentils, strong doubling on BER of LIBERTY, and a rev die crack that starts a D of UNITED and runs in a circular pattern through to C of AMERICA.	EST P 95-120 SE
7	1838 N6 XF+ appealing medium to dark brown. Variety N6 has a long spike protruding off of the leaf tip below R of AMERICA on the rev.	EST P 100-125 SE
8	(4) Diff Classic Heads incl 1808 S-278, 1811 S-287, 1812 S-288, & 1814 Crosslet 4 S-294. All are very low grade but corrosion is minimal and the coins are easily attributed.	EST 210-250 SE
9	(4) Diff Classic Heads incl 1808 S-279, 1810 S-283, 1813 S293, & 1814 Plain 4 S-295. Low grades but corrosion is minimal and the coins are easily discernable.	EST 250-300 SE
10	(33) 1816 // 1854 w/ very minor dup. Earlies mostly G to F, later a bit better. Expect typical early copper imperfections.	EST 320-400 LE
11	(41) Diff in a straight run 1816 // 1856 in a Whit 9110 album generally low grades w/ impairments. Inspection recommended.	EST 200-250 A

12	1859 Uncirculated. The coin has been lightly cleaned but has a full strike and ample eye-appeal. A nice example of the one-year type!	EST P 220-300 SE

This variety of the 64-L is the one with a large die crack going through the 6 in the date. There are also dramatic clashed dies on this coin. Though it has a few stray marks, it is still desirable. 14	1867 XF or very nearly so. Lovely chocolate brown original.	EST P 115-140 SE
15	1868 XF+ perhaps better. A light rev scratch above NE of ONE.	EST P 125-150 SE

55	1795 Flowing Hair perhaps VG by wear but a small bend in the coin has caused the wear to be a bit uneven. The right edge of the coin appears to have been filed. Flaws of this kind are typical of small coins of the period. The present example is still original and attractive and likely represents an affordable example of this scarce early type. 56	1803 Large 8 Draped Bust AG. Imperfections consistent w/ very small coins of the period, this coin has details clear enough for identification, and an eye-catching bold date. Inspect!	EST P	600-900	SE
<b>Bust Dimes</b>				
57	1805 4 Berries perhaps G+/VG by wear but there is light damage and a 2mm hole behind Liberty's head at stars 5 & 6. The date and bust are fairly strong. (Problems coins are the norm for most early dimes.)	EST P	270-350	SE
58	1807 Draped Bust G by wear w/ damage in the form of scratches and edge filing but still ok for type. Draped Bust dimes rarely come w/o some type of significant imperfection.	EST P	220-300	SE

<b>Seated Dimes</b>				
60	1843-O AG original. The only issue is extensive wear. Bowers notes that this coin is scarce in all grades with a less than .5% survival rate.	EST	64-85	SE
61	1844 G+ by wear. There is light damage. This is the famous "Orphan Annie" dime made famous in the 1930s by Frank Ross once he realized that the 1844 was a scarce issue.	EST P	100-125	SE
62	1861-S F+ detail. A 3mm blemish in the center of the obv has been repaired but the coin has nice natural color and is still attractive. This issue is noted as "fairly scarce in any grade" in "The Complete Guide to Liberty Seated Dimes" by Brian Greer (DLRC Press 1992.)	EST P	135-170	SE
63	1870-S AG. Minted to the extent of only 50,000 pieces most of which ended up in the orient via international trade. Greer notes that this issue is very scarce in any grade, is always weak at "ONE DIME", and is almost always found w/ problems. The only problem with the present coin is honest wear which, though extensive, is not accompanied by any other damage.	EST	120-145	SE
64	1871-CC G details but w/ a 2.5mm hole @ K11 o/w nice original grey. All Carson City dimes from 1871 to 1874 are classic rarities. Bowers notes that they are highly prized in any state of preservation. In Greer's "Complete Guide to Liberty Seated Dimes", it is noted that "the 1871-CC dime is a great rarity and one of the keys to the series." Clearly the scarcity of this issue is not exaggerated as the Greysheet bid price (Mar 2023) for one in just Good-4 condition is \$3,000!	EST P	1,100-1,400	SE
65	1878-CC Type 2 Rev - Obv Fine; Rev Good. Very scarce in circulated condition per Bowers, most coins found are often in low grades. The weakly-struck Type 2 reverse often results in a two-grade difference between obv & rev and an unsatisfactory appearance. In Greer's book, a photo of the type 2 rev looks identical to the present coin. The mintmark is very weak but can be seen if the coin is tilted.	EST P	160-200	SE
66	1885-S Fine detail and original in appearance but here are numerous small surface nicks on obv & rev. Bowers has opined that circulated coins of this issue are notorious for having "rough" surfaces, the cause of which is unknown. Greer notes that this issue is a series key in all grades. He also presents diagnostics for authenticity, the present coin conforming to all of them. An opportunity for the Seated Dime enthusiast!	EST P	500-650	SE
<b>Barber Dimes</b>				
67	(100) assorted most are 20th Cent. G to VG+ originals.	EST	160-200	BAG
<b>Mercury Dimes</b>				
68	(20) Diff 1916 // 1945-S common dates in 2x2s a couple lower-grade earliest but mostly post-1925 AU and Unc coins. A nice lot of Mercury Dimes!	EST	85-110	LE

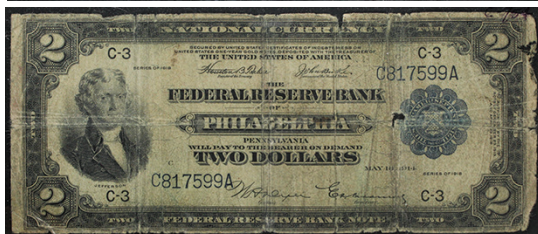

70	(2) 1957 BU Rolls all blast white except for some toning on the end coins. From a recent PA estate liquidation. (100 coins total)	EST	160-200	HWC-ROLL

74	1875-S G+ original. The distinguishing feature is that the coin is a broadstrike. This is an error that occurs when the collar that holds the planchet during striking fails to engage. The result is that coin has an indistinct periphery and, given that there is no collar during striking, a slightly wider diameter than that of a normal coin. Error twenty-cent pieces are seldom encountered.	EST P	100-125	SE
<b>Bust Quarters</b>				
75	1805 Draped Bust Browning-2 VG+ detail. Perfectly original and a decent grade but w/ a plugged hole obliterating the "18" of the date.	EST P	135-170	SE
76	(2) Draped Bust incl 1818 (B8) & 1825 over 4 over 2 (B3) both original AG/G. The 1825 has light obv graffiti from long long ago. It would be interesting to know what it signified.	EST	135-170	SE
77	1824 over 2 PCGS VG Detail Tooled. Obviously cleaned but maintains some of its original color and is still attractive overall. PCGS is noting it as "tooled" because a previous attempt to remove dirt left light scratches by the date. Magnification is required to see the marks clearly. Fifty years ago the 1824 was no more expensive than other dates of the Bust series. But its value has increased dramatically as its true scarcity became more well known.	EST P	400-550	SE

79	1855-O G+ original. A scarce date and a nice coin for the grade. Bowers notes that circulated coins of this issue are most encountered well-worn w/ multiple problems.	EST P	125-150	SE
80	1858-S AG. Rev is full-rim G but the obv is weaker. The mintage of this issue is quite low (96,000), but the survival rate is well under average making circulated specimens very scarce. It is virtually unknown in true mint state.	EST P	100-125	SE
