1806 Draped Bust Small 6; No Stems F+, even chocolate brown.
21825 Classic Head C2 variety VF
31826 Classic Head near XF w/ mostly original color. Displays full 180-degree die rotation.
41828 Classic Head 13 Stars MS60 faint traces of red still remain.
51850 Braided Hair AU cleaned and recolored, still nice for a scarce issue.

## Large Cents

61794 Liberty Cap Head of 94 S-46 near VF detail but as is frequently the case, there are a few planchet defects that lower the coin's net grade (to perhaps VG?) Though loaded w/ detail, the obv shows pitting in the center, the rev has a 10 mm lamination mark from the rim by the " $D$ " in UNITED moving thru the wreath and extending to the " $O^{\prime \prime}$ in ONE. Despite the damage, this is still a desirable coin and a nice example of early copper.
71795 Liberty Cap Lettered Edge S-75 Good. On this variety, the 5 of the date overlaps the bust of Liberty and becomes difficult to see clearly on worn specimens. However, there are enough diagnostics remaining to determine that it is indeed an S-75.
81795 Liberty Cap S-78 AG
91797 Draped Bust Rev of '97 Stemless Wreath S-131 G+. This variety is easily distinguished by the 5 mm heavy obv die break behind the hair ribbon.

101797 Draped Bust S-137 Good. This coin shows a very late die state w/ ERICA obliterated by a large rev cud. The rev is about $5 \%$ off-center as well. Date and legends all very clear despite the low grade.
111798 Draped Bust 2nd Hair Style S-161 G+ Detail net AG3. Clearly discernable despite the low grade, the large rev cud above ATES of STATES identifies this coin as a late die state S-161.
121802 Draped Bust S-235 VG+ nice detail for the grade and a good coin for type. Better variety as well.
131810 over 09 Classic Head S-281 F or slightly better by wear, w/ a few light verdigris spots on the rev.
141812 Classic Head S-289 near F detail on dark brown surfaces typical of copper coins of the period.
151814 Classic Head Plain 4 S-295 VF (or better) detail, but uniformly corroded. Undoubtedly an excavated coin, with a bit of work it could be made presentable.
16 (3) Diff Draped Bust incl 1801 S-224 G w/ rev cud over AME clear; 1803 Small Date; Large Fraction S-259 AG, wear is a bit uneven, \& 1807 S-276 Good. Well-worn coins but no corrosion or other defects so common to early copper.
17 (4) Diff Classic Heads incl 1808 S-278, 1811 S-287, 1813 S-292, \& 1814 Plain 4 S-295 "Bearded". Coins are G/VG by wear and can be clearly identified but on most of them corrosion has taken its toll.
18 (4) Diff Classic Heads incl 1808 S-279, 1810 S-283, 1813 S-293, \& 1814 Plain 4 S-295. Low grades but corrosion is minimal and the coins are easily discernable.
19 (25) 1818 // $1851 \mathrm{w} /$ dup most AG to F (a couple better), typical minor impairments.

## Indian Cents

20 1864-L fully AU by wear but there is an area of discoloration on the top third of the obv. Still very acceptable. View the pic!
$21 \quad 1877$ probably VG detail but heavily damaged. The date shows clearly however, so it would make an excellent filler.
22 1908-S perhaps VG+ by wear but lightly cleaned. Still ok.
23 (50) Diff 1857 // 1909 in a Whit 9003 folder most earlies are low-grade or corroded but there are enough solid G/G+ coins to make the lot desirable (incl an 1864-L in G+). Sev laters show full LIBERTY.
24 (53) Diff 1857 // 1909 in a Whit 9402 album coins gen low-grade among the earlies w/ better laters to a couple VF. Incl 64-L, 66 thru 69, $72, \& 78.1908$-S is barely discernable but there.

27 (Abt 5,000) Wheat Cents in a US Mint bag avg circ. Unsearched by us, but most appear to be 1940 // 1958 but there may be some pre-1930 as well as a few memorials here and there. (The bag weighs 34 lbs which is equal to 5,000 copper cents.)

35 1913-D Type 2 nice original F/F+ w/ a few faint scratches. Bonus: a second 1913-D T2 in an even higher technical grade, uniformly corroded but acceptable.
36 A 1913 extravaganza! This lot incl (4) 1913 Type 1, (8) 1913-D Type 1, and (6) 1913 Type 2 coins. A couple of blemishes here and there but most are full-horn VF or better. Great lot for Ebay re-sellers!

## Bust Dimes

3918054 Berries perhaps G+/VG by wear but there is light damage and a 2 mm hole behind Liberty's head at stars 5 \& 6. The date and bust are fairly strong. (Problem coins are the norm for most early dimes.)
401820 Large 0 JR-5 (R4) original VG w/ a few marks. A "very scarce" variety per "Early United States Dimes 1796-1837" by Davis, Logan, Lovejoy, McCloskey, \& Subjack (1984). Bowers opines that there are only 100 to 150 of this variety in all circulated grades.
$41 \quad 1827$ JR-12 Fine. Beautiful medium grey.
421831 JR-3 VF or better. Lovely light grey original.

## Seated Dimes

43 1841-O VF+ with good facial detail which is often weak on the 1841-O as it is on many Seated Dimes. Some authorities question the reported mintage of this issue $(2,007,500)$ as specimens are far scarcer than this number would suggest.

$44 \quad$ 1861-S F+ detail. A 3mm blemish in the center of the obv has been repaired but the coin has nice natural color and is still attractive. This issue is noted as "fairly scarce in any grade" in "The Complete Guide to Liberty Seated Dimes" by Brian Greer (DLRC Press 1992.)
45 1870-S AG. Minted to the extent of only 50,000 pieces most of which ended up in the orient via international trade. Greer notes that this issue is very scarce in any grade, is always weak at "ONE DIME", and is almost always found w/ problems. The only problem with the present coin is honest wear which, though extensive, is not accompanied by any other damage.
46 1871-CC G details but w/ a 2.5 mm hole @ K11 o/w nice original grey. All Carson City dimes from 1871 to 1874 are classic rarities. Bowers notes that they are highly prized in any state of preservation. In Greer's "Complete Guide to Liberty Seated Dimes", it is noted that "the 1871CC dime is a great rarity and one of the keys to the series." Clearly the scarcity of this issue is not exaggerated as the Greysheet bid price (Oct 2023) for one in just Good-4 condition is $\$ 3,000$ !
