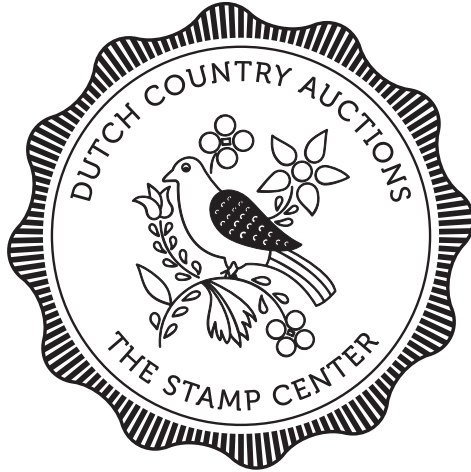

Bidding

1. The placing of a bid will constitute acceptance of the conditions of sale.
2. All bids are per lot as numbered in the catalog. The right is reserved to withdraw any lot or lots and to group two or more lots.
3. Lots are sold to the highest bidder at one advance over the second highest bid. The auctioneer shall regulate the bidding and in the event of any dispute the auctioneer's decision shall be final.
4. The auctioneer shall not be liable for errors and omissions in executing instructions to bid.
5. Unlimited bids and bids believed not to be made in good faith will be respectfully declined.
6. Minimum bid on any lot is \$50.00.
7. All lots will be sold at the price for which they are knocked down by the auctioneer, plus a commission of 15%.

Payment of Purchases

8. Successful bidders will be notified of lots purchased and must remit before lots are delivered. Persons who are known to us may, at our option, have purchases forwarded for immediate payment.
9. Terms are immediate payment in U.S. funds on receipt of the invoice. Payment by credit card will be subject to a 2% service charge.
10. The mode of shipment shall be at our option unless we are given specific instructions. A minimum charge of \$1.50 will be made in addition to postage, insurance, and handling.
11. Successful bidders agree to pay for lots as specified above and no credit is extended. For overdue accounts a late charge of 5% per month (minimum \$30.00) will be charged. Accounts are considered overdue after (30) days.

Quality

12. Any lot, the description of which is incorrect, is returnable within ten (10) days of receipt and must be received within four weeks from the date of the auction. All disputed lots must be returned intact in the condition received. The following lots may not be returned without prior approval: lots from buyers who have had the opportunity to examine them before the sale; lots described as having defects or faults may not be returned because of faults; and, lots in which the buyer has bid more than double our estimate. No illustrated lot may be returned because of centering, margins, or other factors shown in the illustrations.

Authenticity

13. All lots are sold as genuine, but should any lot be proved otherwise by written opinion of any responsible authority acceptable to us, immediate refund of the full purchase price will be made, provided we are notified in writing within 14 days from date of sale that an opinion is being sought. If claim is not made within this period, no lots are returnable for any reason at any time. We will not be responsible for any charges incurred by the buyer for expertization fees and costs unless the opinion states the item is not genuine, in which case we will pay actual costs up to a maximum of \$100.00. In the event an item is proved "not as described" it is returnable for a full refund. Any lot which has a certificate dated within the last five years is sold in accordance with the certificate and is not returnable for any reason including an opinion obtained in a new certificate after the sale. While we occasionally suggest what grade a coin may receive if certified, we do guarantee that grade (or any other grade) if a coin is submitted for certification.

Bowers has opined that this is the rarest issue from the Carson City Mint save for the 1873-CC No Arrows. 8,340 was the total mintage, most circulated in the dusty Carson City area, and by the time they began to be collected (around 1900), the overwhelming majority were either lost or completely worn out. (Low mintages were the order of the day for the Carson City Mint in the early 1870s; so much so the the same reverse die was used to produce ALL the CC coins from 1870 thru 1873. Even in the lowly grade of Good, the 1870-CC has a greysheet price of \$7,800.) A great opportunity for the Seated Quarter enthusiast.	EST	3,000-3,500	SE
61	1871-CC AG overall w/ a few marks. Another rare Carson City Seated Quarter. Though more were minted this year compared to the 1870-CC (10,890 vs 8,370), the 1871-CC is a rarer coin. PCGS and NGC combined have graded a total of only 70 1871-CCs, whereas the combined population of the 1870-CC is 110. The present coin, with a complete obv rim, may be considered stronger in condition than the previous lot; however, it has a weaker rev and some marks. With a greysheet price in the grade of Good at \$8,500 our estimate seems conservative. In any case, here is another great opportunity for those seriously interested in the Seated Quarter series. 62	1872-S perhaps VG detail but rough surfaces from an attempt to remove a foreign substance that once adhered to the coin. Bowers notes the peripheral weakness on the rev from K5 to K9. Roy Ash did a study on Seated Quarters for the Gobrecht Journal in 1987, and noted that among the San Francisco issues, the 1872-S was the one least encountered.	EST	500-750	SE
